It was awesome to hear their natural curiosity about the ocean and share their current knowledge.



Our season started with some returning members from under 6/7s and some kids who were new to both South Port and SLS. Despite less than ideal weather conditions in October we saw more than half our Nippers attempt the ocean proficiency the first time we went out. We even had one successfully complete it on the first try!

Initially we spent time encouraging the kids to bond and ask questions with the support of our Surf Ed training. As more of our Under 8's became proficient we saw increased enthusiasm toward boards with more of our Nippers heading out each week in spite of swell size. We also saw our Nippers strive to improve by attending the weekly board trainings and swim sessions mid-week.

Although some of our Nippers were slightly nervous to compete against other clubs, the carnival held at South Port allowed them to experience team events in a familiar space and we saw an increase in attendance and enthusiasm in subsequent carnivals. It also sparked some healthy competition within our group and many of our under 8's began to recognise and acknowledge each other's strengths

As the season progressed, we saw a huge shift in our natural water babies and land dwellers. Those who consistently went out each week began to gain confidence and strength in the ocean and others who were reluctant to participate in runs began to see its value. This meant by the end of season some who were strongest on land switched to water and vice versa, making a formidable group!

The biggest change we saw this season was that each Nipper stretched themselves outside of their comfort zone. Whether it was in specific events, making new friendships, supporting others, or finding community around the club. Eventually, they even started to listen to their AGM's \odot

Thank you to this under 10 group who are passionate energetic funny resilient and kind.



This season our under 10 group had some energetic new additions to add to our enthusiastic group. This gave us even numbers throughout the age group of boys and girls and allowed us to practise many team activities with different combinations of children from week to week.

This season we worked hard to try and balance our Saturday afternoon Nippers into fun, easy sessions as well as solid, challenging sessions. Not all children are the same and so balancing what was fun for everyone was something that we wanted to incorporate more this season.

Surf lifesaving is about safety on our beaches and in our waters. So, each week the children would head out into the water to complete their swim and board around the cans which helped them to become more confident each week about being in the water.

During Surf Ed, we particularly learned a lot about our beach and the water conditions, often having children come to us to discuss what the water was doing and how that would impact them and any other person out there (and of course we had many requests to "please go out into the big waves"). This was positive for our group because it meant that their knowledge and understanding for the beach and surf lifesaving was improving and it was being put to practise each time they were at the beach.

Whilst there were times where the conditions meant we had to make the trek down to the hump, we did have many opportunities to get out the front into some much bigger waves and challenging conditions. It was so positive to see that all under 10's who chose to give the swim and board a go were successfully getting out and around the cans which proved that the practise of their skills was helping them to become stronger Nippers. In some sessions we would give them an opportunity to do a longer distance swim and board (at the request of the children) to which they all completed without any assistance or problems.

Following a few sessions in the bigger surf and further distances we then spent time with the under 11's age group. This was a great opportunity for all children to swim, run, board, wade against children of similar levels to them. It also gave each age group more opportunities to work as a team in their own age group, promoting a positive team environment for children at all levels. Each child had the opportunity to play a part in something which was their strength, and this made the sessions fun, encouraging participation each week.

Our numbers at carnivals, swim and board trainings grew this year which added to our positive team environment. At state titles we had 12 participants which allowed us to enter all children into teams for all States events.
