

OBJECTIVES

The Objectives of the Club are:-

- (a) To minimise the loss of life from drowning by providing efficient life saving patrols and apparatus.
- (b) To adopt the gear, drill and handbooks of the Surf Life Saving Association of Australia, to patrol that portion of Port Noarlunga Beach, south of the reef to the mouth of the Onkaparinga River or to be on call within the Municipality of Noarlunga on such days and for such periods as the Branch shall from time to time determine.
- (c) To promote demonstrations and arrange classes of instruction in life saving.
- (d) To obtain facilities for life saving and to assist the Corporation of the City of Noarlunga and other Public Bodies in imposing facilities for bather.
- (e) To encourage the physical and social welfare of its members.
- (f) To purchase, take on lease, exchange, hire or otherwise acquire and deal with any real or personal property rights or privileges.
- (g) To raise funds and borrow monies for the purposes and benefit of the Club upon such terms and such conditions as may be determined.



REVIEW OF CLUB ACTIVITIES

SECRETARY'S REPORT

Ladies and Gentlemen,

I am pleased to present for your consideration and adoption the 27th Annual Report and Financial Statement of South Port S.L.S.C. Incorporated.

My summary of the season's activities is as follows:-

LIFE SAVING

No lives were lost at South Port.

As a testimony to this very important statement is the fact that:-

- 14 rescues were carried out
- 29 preventative actions were undertaken
- 34 cases of first aid occurred
- 1921 patrol hours were completed with average of 33 hours per member. In addition at the State Championships:-
 - Champion Patrol equal 3rd
 - First Aid Competition 1st.

ASSOCIATION AWARDS

Thirty nine awards were obtained including 9 Bronze Medallions. This number appears consistent with the vagaries of each season as can be seen in the statistics.

This is an area that we should all be aware of and encourage the achievement of these awards.

COMPETITION

Fourth at the State Titles at Moana and 3 bronze medals at the Australian Titles - a creditable effort.

MEMBERSHIP

Membership is down on statistics however I feel that this is due to the more stringent conditions applying to membership qualifications and payment of fees.

It is worth noting that Active membership is down and if this continues it will be of major concern to the club.

We are here to be lifesavers - all the rest is just trimmings.

FINANCE

Once more major contributors to the finance of the club were the bar and canteen.

The Treasurer's comprehensive report details the situation.

CLUBHOUSE

The club was officially opened by the Minister for Recreation & Sport, Mr Jack Slater on Sunday 20/10/85. There was a large crowd of officials, benefactors and supporters in attendance - it was a most successful day. I believe that this function "opened the eyes" of a number of people to what we do and what we have achieved.

FUTURE

The following matters will have to be finalised in the near future.

New Members - New (particularly active) members should be encouraged. The basis of lifesaving is the patrolling member on the beach - without this person there is, in my opinion, no purpose for a club to exist.

We live on public support and government funding on the basis that we hold ourselves out to be proficient at saving lives. This must be maintained.

Bronze Medallion Winners

- The Bronze Medallion is the most important award of Surf Life Saving.

I feel that we should endeavour to ensure that all who obtain the Bronze Medallion should be honoured at a function and presented with a T shirt suitably printed which is given only to Bronze Medallion holders.

Constitution -The club Constitution is due to be overhauled.

and To be done properly it will need to take into consideration

Administration not only the conditions of a surf club but also the Licencing Act, Incorporated Associates Act, to name just two. It should also be checked and verified by a Solicitor to test its effectiveness and validity.

Administration of any organisation is one of the major contributors to its success. I have heard comments about the necessity to consider more and more paid workers for the S.L.S.A. and also in clubs. While I can see the merit in this to some degree at National Council or State Centre, I question whether it is the right way to go.

I feel that the answer is not to pay some people to do more work but to spread the work through more (voluntary) members. South Port should consider co-opting or appointing (non committee) assistants to various club officials so that the work load can be spread and those that help obtain experience.

Club Work

- There are 295 members in South Port (including Juniors). Besides patrols, the following regular work is required
 - canteen
 - bar
 - cleaning club
 - assistance in setting up and taking down at surf carnivals to name just the basics.

The surf season goes for about 20-24 weeks. It is obvious that there is more than ample person power to help once a season. Let's read the newsletter and get here and help.

Water and Electricity

- The reticulation systems for water and electricity will have to be amended next season.

I suggest that an approach be made for any recreation grants etc. that may be available to fund this important work.

APPRECIATION

I would like to record the club's appreciation of the magnificent donation of the club Honour Board and Trophy Case by Tony and Josie HORTON.

Thank you both. It was an outstanding contribution.

THANK YOU

As Secretary I come in contact with most members and the majority of them have been helpful to me. I would however like to mention the following people:

Mick and Maureen Shead for getting all the club records straight and applications processed.

Tony Horton for sorting out the licencing provisions and laws that apply. Thanks.

CONCLUSION

I feel that it has been a good season for learning for a lot of us.


I am sure that those that joined the committee for the first time learned quite a lot both positive and negative but all to their advantage.

To all members who gained awards or competed at carnivals my congratulations.


Special mention must be made at this time of the achievements of Sam Peacock at both State and National level. He is a credit to himself and to SOUTH PORT.

CAPTAIN'S REPORT

'A difficult year it will be" was the warning as I accepted the position of Captain for this Season, 85-86. As was the case, but interesting also, some aspects were disappointing, others better than expected.

Patrols, the main function of any surf club, worked reasonably well. With a reduced patrolling strength and introduction of personal patrol obligations on a National basis, saw a substantial increase in the average number of hours spent on the beach by our members. A return to the single roster afternoon patrols appeared to work fairly well, absenteeism being reduced compared to last season. One unfortunate trend did appear however, certain members had to 'cram' doing their hours prior to the closing date for entry into the Aussies and States, then neglecting their patrols for the rest of the season.

Thanks must be extended to John Nearmy and his troops in the carnival patrol, the commitment was exceptional, the average number of hours by this group was in excess of 70 hours each for the season. Well done.

Competition this year provided a mixed bag. Our small group of juniors and cadets proved themselves as the best group that any club could wish to have, they gave their most all season. Our Open ranks unfortunately continued to thin and of course the Boaties were at the other end of the beach going their hardest!

The most outstanding performance must be that of Sam Peacock, State Titles Gold in Cadet Iron Man, Run Swim Run, Surf Race and Malibu. He also teamed up with Sam Keelan and Keith Rowlings in the Cadet Malibu and Ski Relays being victorious in both events. This was on top of his National Junior Titles effort in January. Mention must be made of the performance by Gavin Steel in the State Titles, successfully defending his Junior Iron Man Title and gaining three other gold medals on the day. Many other juniors and cadets performed well at the State Titles and they must all be congratulated for their effort. Special mention must also be made of Tim Peacock who competed consistently all year and was selected in the State Team.

Our junior craft competitors again proved themselves at the Australian Championships. Bronze medals were gained by David Pummeroy in the Junior Ski and the Steel/Liptak combination in the Junior Double Ski.

The club again proved its strength in March Past repeating last year's performance of first and third in the State Titles, and the dedication of the team was again rewarded by gaining a bronze medal in the Australian Championships for the second year in succession. According to some, unlucky not to do better.

Co-hosting the Australian Championships was another major task the club had to meet in addition to conducting three carnivals and our inaugural triathlon. Thanks must go to all members who contributed to the conducting of these events.

Special thanks must go to Andy Higgs and John Parker of St. Johns who prepared our First Aid teams this year. Our team of Anita Higgs and Sue Stewart broke Seacliff's five year hold on this Championship. Also later in the season our patrols were tested to the full when they became involved in varied simulated accidents. Those involved enjoyed the experience and I hope that this 'First Aid Training' becomes a regular feature for all patrols next year.

In concluding I would like to thank all those people who have helped me throughout the season, it has been an enjoyable experience but unfortunately I cannot stand for this position next year due to work commitments (being transferred interstate). I must impress that persons standing for any position


next year must realise the importance of that position and devote the appropriate time to fulfilling that task.

VICE CAPTAIN'S REPORT

1985-86 was a much improved season for South Port in the patrolling area. I decided to go back to the old method of patrolling instead of shifts and it certainly paid off. People missing patrols was cut down to half and there were less patrols to do.

CHIEF INSTRUCTOR'S REPORT

Normally the group of Juniors that we train in the late winter months provides an adequate influx of new Senior members but this year that total was so small that we scrambled all throughout the season to build our numbers by processing a seemingly endless stream of mini-squads and even then our Bronze Medallion tally was half of last year's total. This situation was caused by the unfortunate slump in Junior numbers and the Club must either reverse this trend or mount an effective campaign to recruit Senior personnel.

I thank the I.R.B. crews for their support in the preparation and presentation of candidates and I congratulate all of those who worked so hard to achieve their various awards. Your well earned successes make the effort worthwhile. My only regret for this year is that there just aren't enough Bronze Medallions for comfort.

RICARDO MID COAST TRIATHLON

Because of our sketchy knowledge of the Triathlon scene our decision to organise. the inaugural Ricardo Mid Coast Triathlon could be seen as foolhardy or overly ambitious but once it was entered on their calendars of events we were committed (or should that be "trapped"). We worked closely with the Triathlon Association, the Road Runners and Road Racers clubs, they provided equipment, manpower and invaluable expertise to operate the run and cycle sections which left us the swim, the interchange area and overall control of the day.

We then contacted the Noarlunga Council, the Police and St. Johns to find a pandoras box of goodwill and assistance. The Council bitumised a footpath, repaired walkways, closed a road and provided signs, barriers and bunting as required while the Police manned the potential dangers "stop" sign intersections at Weatherald Tce., Maslins and Aldinga to give the cyclists preference wherever possible and the St. Johns set up their base in our car park and then provided mobile cover in all areas. The co-operation of these three groups was outstanding, freely given and very sincerely appreciated, especially as none had any financial interest in the procedures.

The result of all of this activity left us only the provision of water cover for the swim and when the S.L.S.A. supplemented the I.R.B. flotilla with both jet boats it looked like a classic overkill for safety but the conditions of the day forced us to move behind the dubious shelter of the Noarlunga reef and all safety craft stayed busy throughout the swim.

In retrospect, our decision to run the first half triathlon in South Australia at that particular time proved fortunate, we were well supported by local and interstate entries and once the pain had subsided favourable comments on the course and organisation came freely. Our only possible detraction this year was the decision to operate on a non-profit basis as an experiment. Now we know the pitfalls we will certainly remedy that without taking anything away from the participants next year.

BOAT REPORT

This season has seen a marked improvement within the boat area with the 'A' crew making most finals and achieving a 3rd at the Christies Carnival.

The Reserve crew although having difficulty holding a full crew together, made it to semi finals. With a few more dedicated rowers we should have a stronger crew next season. The 'C' crew had a very good season making most finals and gaining placings during the later half of the season.

Many thanks must go to the older chaps who decided that they were not "over the hill" as many people thought and gained points for the club in the Veteran boat race.

Next season will see a higher achievement by all crews with dedicated winter training, sandhill (torture track) runs and work outs on the new gym equipment. Thanks to Chris "Dollar" Foord for the organising and setting up of the surf club gym which should prove to be an asset to all club members now and in the future.

POWER CRAFT CAPTAIN'S REPORT

The South Port Power Craft team once again continued their high class service to this Club. The I.R.B. drivers and crews put in a total of 356% hours in the boat this year, a monumental effort. During this time they performed 22 preventative actions and 3 rescues (1 craft rescue and 2 swimmers).

Training for I.R.B. awards commenced in early June 1985 and finally after 6 months of training and some good and bad luck at times, we achieved 3 new awards. Congratulations to Tony Dawson (I.R.B. driver), Martin Day (I.R.B. crew) and Kevin Stephens (I.R.B. instructor). Our greatest loss for the season was Ray Willsmore who unfortunately broke his foot during training and was unable to obtain his award.

This year for the first time we had an I.R.B. patrol roster separate from the patrol roster. This system worked well but next year I would like to have enough qualified drivers to put 2 drivers on each patrol. There are only 12 qualified peiple in the club of which 5 were rostered to the patrols. Thanks to Leonie Stephens, Natalie Parks, Peter Sutton and Robin Atkinson for helping me on these patrols. Thanks to the other 28 people in the club who went out and either crewed or drove with these people. Maybe some of you could become qualified next season.

This season S.L.S.A. decided to have I.R.B. competitions in this State. This enables the I.R.B. drivers and crews to keep up to date in rescue operations and maintain a high standard of I.R.B. operation in the club. The results of the competition at Moana on 20th April show that we are up with the rest of the Snate in I.R.B. operations. Congratulations to the I.R.B. drivers who competed in this competition.

Finally I would like to thank all the people who helped me keep the I.R.B. going this year. Firstly, the I.R.B. drivers and crews for keeping the boat on patrol for every patrol this year. Secondly, to the patrols for assisting us in carrying the boat up and down the beach for each patrol. Without you we would not be able to patrol the beach. Thirdly, thanks to the Stagg brothers for their assistance with boat maintenance and finally, thanks to Bob, Wally and everybody at Adelaide Outboard Service for keeping the motor in top condition this year.

With the 1985/86 season all but complete in the competition arena, South Port has once again put in commendable performances.


The pinnacle of competition once again was the Australian Championships held at Moana Beach in late March. South Port acquitted itself well collecting 3 bronze medals with the congratulations going to Bob Mayo and his March Past tribe, Gavin Steel and Danny Liptak (Junior Double Ski) and David Pummeroy (Junior Single Ski) for these top performances. Many other fine performances were put in over the championships by club competitors in all areas covering first aid, beach, swim, ski, board and boat events. More hard training and better luck next year!

A creditable 4th position was obtained at the State Titles, although not as high up as previous years we were still right up there fighting it out like a top club should. Once again all competitors put in their best performances for the club.




