ATTACHMENT RE PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION

In accordance with paragraph 26 of the Constitution, notice is hereby given of the following proposed amendments to the Constitution and By Laws.

- 1. Amend paragraph 19 "Officers of the Club" by the addition of Assistant Secretary/Registrar.
- 2. Amend paragraph 20 "General Committee" by the addition of Assistant Secretary/Registrar.
- 3. Amend the By-Laws by the addition of the following under the heading of "Duties of Officers"

Assistant Secretary/Registrar

- 1) Shall be responsible for keeping minute books of the proceedings of the Committee and of General meetings and shall produce them at each Committee and/or General Meeting.
- 2) Shall be responsible for keeping such register of Members of the Club as the Committee may from time to time direct and shall process all applications for membership and effect annual registration of members with the Surf Life Saving Association of Australia as required from time to time.
- 3) Shall be responsible for the co-ordination and distribution of general Club notices and/or circulars to Members as required.
- 4) Shall carry out such other duties as delegated by the Honorary Secretary.
- 4. Amend the By-Laws by the deletion of the following under the "Duties of Officers"

Honorary Secretary

- 2 Shall keep minute books of the proceedings of the Committee and of general meetings and produce them at each Committee or General Meeting.
- 3 Shall keep such register of Members of the Club as the committee from time to time directs.

Explanation

Because of the ever increasing work load placed on the Honorary Secretary it is seen as advisable to create the new position of Assistant Secretary/Registrar to handle some of the more routine matters presently under the control of the Honorary Secretary.

The creation of such a position and the division of duties will allow the Honorary Secretary to devote his time to the more vital areas under his control and experience gained in fulfilling the requirements of the position of Assistant Secretary/Registrar may prove valuable as training of future Honorary Secretaries.

The 1982/83 season began and within a few weeks the season seemed destined to be over. The loss of a club and its gear meant that the pressures upon all members would be intensified, but the support by all members reduced this pressure dramatically. But unfortunately many of our members did not complete the requirements for patrolling either in the form of penalty patrols or did not complete the required 20 hours. In conclusion, I would urge that next year all members approach patrols with a more positive approach and all commitments be completed at the end of the season rather than the beginning of the next season. It has been suggested that registration will be subject to completion of patrol commitments.

CHIEF INSTRUCTOR'S REPORT

The annual apology to the Advance Resuscitation hopefuls had become an unacceptable embarassment so we reversed the programme to cater for them, the long list of Certificates gained and re-exams completely justified the exercise.

Unfortunately when we progressed to the Bronze medallion, the level of dedication varied dramatically, in spite of the instructor's persistent emphasis on the need for swim fitness and the development of belt, board, ambu and oxy skills there were still some candidates who had not started to properly apply themselves by the time the examination day rolled around. I seriously considered reducing the squads but eventually took a gamble that the fire related sympathy vote would save the day if things got sticky and I presented the whole batch on the prescribed day. Two squads sailed through and one was rejected but a combination of hurt pride and resentment at their "unfair treatment" spurred this group on to become, within two short weeks, the best Bronze squad that I have seen South Port present.

Once the challenge of that examination was over, routine Profficiency testing and Qualifying and Resuscitation Certificate instruction and examination kept us occupied until the New Year when I assessed the remaining Bronze and Qualifying aspirants as generally uncommitted and closed off for the season.

Naturally the fire created problems for my Bronze squads but these were neutralised through the generosity of the Port Noarlunga Club, they gave us access to all gear and facilities and we have every reason to be grateful for this magnificent support. It seems that all sections of the Club have helped me in the last year but I must single out Don Brady, Glen Steel and John Nearmy (Superfish) for the many hours of instruction undertaken between them, my workload was reducted to a tolerable level and our combined efforts have enabled South Port to achieve a record number of Association Awards.

Having ghost written the Club House Director's report I believe it would be discourteous to the members rephrase his closing comments to give them added weight however I honestly would not complain too much if our Clubhouse was rebuilt and ready for occupation by late September at the latest!

GEAR STEWARD'S REPORT

TREASURER'S REPORT

Due to the fire I, like most of the committee, have found my position most demanding this past season. In total over \$50,000 passed through the general club account in 1982/83.

Currently club balances total almost \$14,000 which along with our impending insurance claim for \$62,714 should see us in a sound financial position from which to begin the rebuilding of the clubhouse in the forthcoming season. I would like to thank Marion Wilson and her clan of helpers whose efforts, despite primitive facilities, managed to raise over \$6,000 of canteen profit over the course of las summer.

The major source of income this year has come from local community groups who have seen the necessity for the re-establishment of our club.

At the time of audit expected income includes a considerable donation towards rebuilding from the West Beach Apex Club and our share of the remaining profits from the 1982 Australian Titles. (Problems with insurance has considerably delayed the final division of this money). Finally, the audited statements do not bring into account debtors and it is expected that such debts will be recovered early in the 1983/84 financial season.
