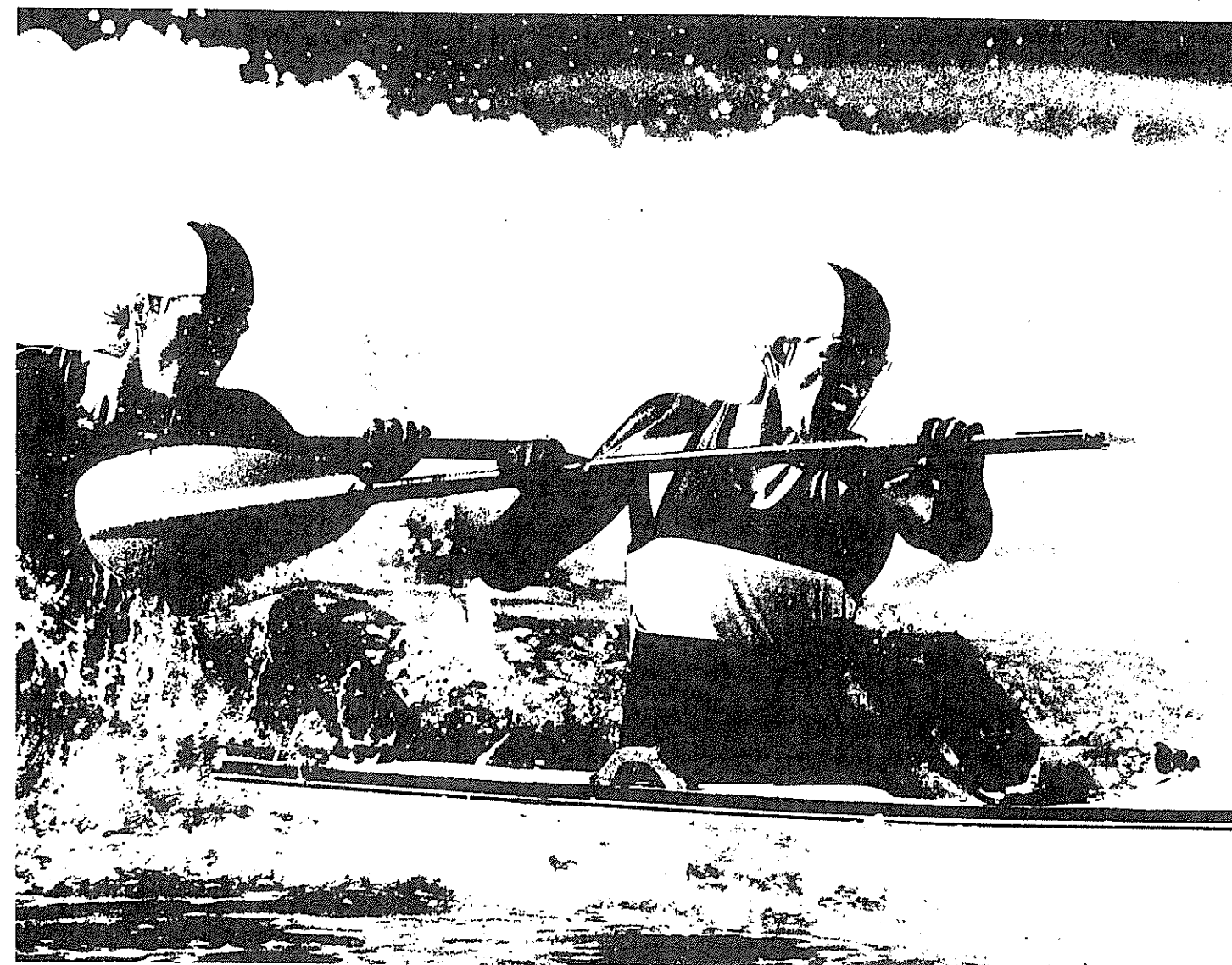

AFFILIATION

The Club is affiliated with the Surf Life Saving Association of Australia (South Australia State Centre).

OBJECTIVES

The objectives of the Club are:-

- To minimise the loss of life from drowning by providing efficient life saving patrols and apparatus.
- To adopt the gear, drill and handbooks of the Surf Life Saving Association of Australia, to patrol that portion of Port Noarlunga Beach, south of the reef to the mouth of the Onkaparinga River or to be on call within the Municipality of Noarlunga on such days and for such periods as the Branch shall from time to time determine.
- To promote demonstrations and arrange classes of instuction in life saving.
- To obtain facilities for life saving and to assist the Corporation of the City of Noarlunga and other Public Bodies in imposing facilities for bathers.
- To encourage the physical and social welfare of its members.
- To purchase, take on lease, exchange, hire or otherwise acquire and deal with any real or personal property rights or privileges.
- To raise funds and borrow monies for the purposes and benefit of the Club upon such terms and such conditions as may be determined.

ACHIEVEMENT OF OBJECTIVES

The objectives of South Port S.L.S.C. Incorporated as listed on Page 3 were achieved during Season 1983 - 1984 and these achievements are summarised as follows:-

- No lives were lost on South Port Beach while the beach was patrolled by South Port club members.
- New handbook introduced by S.L.S.A. State Centre and promulgated to members. Patrols were maintained on all rostered days to watch the area from south to reef to mouth of Onkaparinga River.
- Classes were held throughout the season for Bronze Medallions, Advanced Resucitation and Resucitation Certificates.
- New club house commenced with the assistance of the Corporation of the City of Noarlunga.
- Weekly competition, club championships, State Championships and Australian Championships were part of the club's participation in physical welfare and various social functions, barbeques and dances were held to keep the club together.
- Renewal of licence to occupy club site by Department of Lands.
- Loans were raised though S.L.S.A. State Centre and the Corporation of the City of Noarlunga to complete club house.

FUTURE PLANS

While 1983 - 1984 was a satisfying and hectic season, 1984 - 1985 promises to be equally so. Our major plans are as follows:-

- Complete erection of clubhouse and fit out.
- Arrange official opening of clubhouse.
- Arrange for all gear and equipment to be collected from existing store places and complete inventory.
- Conduct membership drive.
- Increase the number of S.L.S.A. awards by 50%.
- Maintain 100% patrol efficiency.
- Compete in all local carnivals.
- Compete at selected N.S.W., Victorian Carnivals.
- Compete at Australian Championships, Point Leo Victoria in March 1985.
- Ensure that all club records and archives are current.
- Purchase new Surf Boat.

REVIEW OF CLUB ACTIVITIES SECRETARY'S REPORT

Ladies and Gentlemen of South Port S.L.S.C.

It gives me great pleasure to submit for your approval this, our 25th Annual Report and Financial Statement. I sincerely hope that you derive as much pleasure in reading the report as I did in preparing it. I would like to welcome all the "old" members who have taken the trouble to join us for our 25th year.

A review of this Season is as follows:-

LIFE SAVING

(a) PATROLS

No lives were lost on our beach. The patrols were split into 2½ hour periods operating from 12 noon to 2.30 p.m. and 2.30 p.m. to 5.00 p.m. each weekend and public holiday. Fourteen rescues were effected bringing the total of lives saved at South Port to 330 (see Captain's Report on page 17 and Vice Captain's Report on page 18). Average hours per member were cut to 21.35.

(b) AWARDS

The total awards recorded this year totalled 45. This was an excellent result considering the handicaps we faced. Mick Shead's comments can be seen on page 19. The keenness shown was a credit to the members involved.

MEMBERSHIP

Membership increased in all areas except cadets. The statistics show an alarming drop on last year. It appears that this is mainly due to natural attrition and promotion to junior ranks, however, the retention of cadets should be closely monitored. Thanks to all members who "hung in there" again.

FINANCE

High turnover and additional loans due to rebuilding mean that tighter budgetting will be needed next year. See Treasurer's Report on page 30 for the full details.

25 YEARS A SURF CLUB

A Silver Year for South Port. Founded on 1 February 1959 by 7 stalwarts of the Association (3 of whom are still active with us), the Club has had a varied and interesting history. A selection of highlights of the past quarter century appears on page 8.

CLUBHOUSE

A record season without a clubhouse, but, we survived???

Work started in December 1983 and now we are sitting in it, not finished but is soon will be. The delays I know were frustrating and I thank you all for being so patient and also for your support and loyalty. 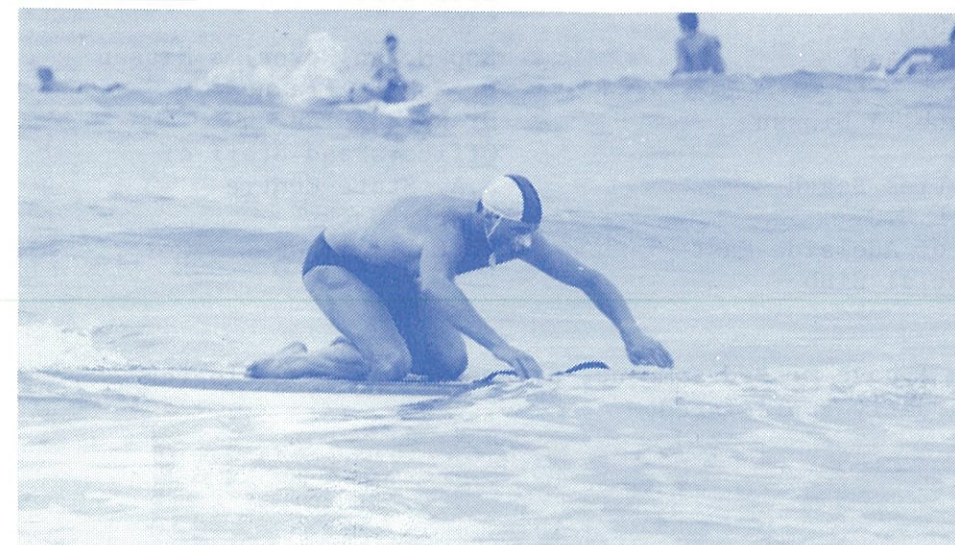

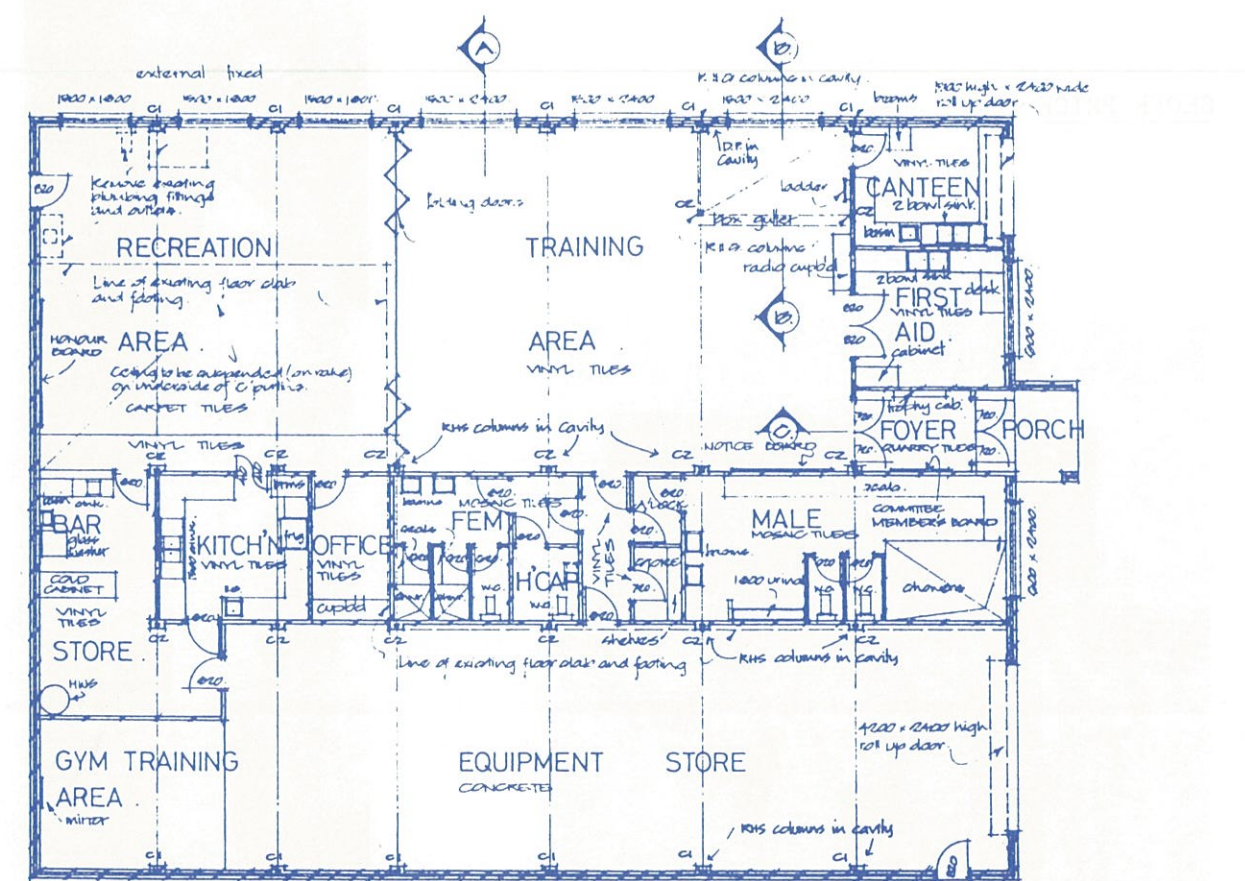
CONCLUSION

VICE CAPTAIN'S REPORT

The 1983 - 84 season again meant that the pressures upon all members would be great, with still the loss of adequate facilities. In order to eliminate to a great deal the pressures that may exist, alternatives were discussed to improve the patrolling environment.

In order to maintain a high standard of service to the members of the public who use South Port beach the following changes were made:-

- . patrolling hours of 2½ hour shifts
(i.e. increased efficiency and enthusiasm in that members patrol for a short period of time)
- . larger number of patrols
(i.e. the recommended hours of patrols were lowered from 20 to 15 hours because of the greater number of patrols)

The result of this is indicated in the Association Patrol Efficiency where South Port recorded a score of 476 out of a possible 500 points. This is surely a good indication of the high standard of service given by the majority of patrolling members of the club. Unfortunately, nothing can be perfect. The new approach brought enthusiasm to members but on the other hand some members felt that by not attending there would always be someone to cover him or her. If you are unable to attend, either -

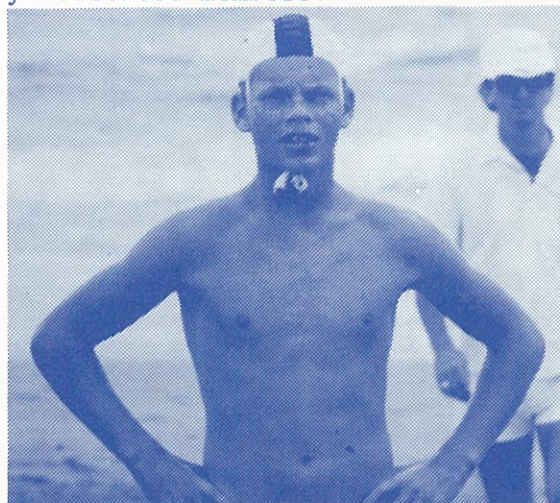
- . inform your patrol Captain; or
- . obtain a substitute

The result of this is that many members did not complete the requirements for patrolling either in the form of penalty patrols or did not complete the required 20 hours.

On the bright side, the beach was patrolled for a total of 1,867½ hours, at an average of 21.35 hours per person.

I would like to commend John Nearmy for his win of the Patrol Hours Trophy with a total of 106 hours. Those to complete 50 hours were D Watt (73), N Shelton (63) and K Stephens (66½). These same four also achieved more than 50 hours last year. They are truly dedicated members.

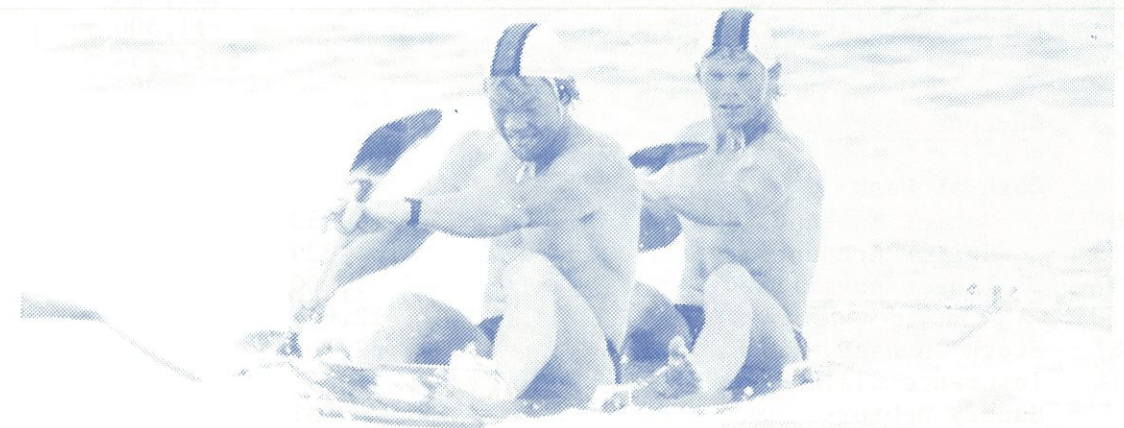

- (e) Repairs and maintenance expenses were up on last year mainly because of very high expenses recorded for the IRB and radios. The IRB maintenance however was sponsored to the tune of \$1,200 by Radio SAFM.
- (f) The valuation of the fixed assets is at our cost and thus the valuation of the clubhouse does not include the cost of labour provided by the Federal Government.

Finally I would like to acknowledge the valuable assistance of Simon Linden in the preparation of the financial statement.

TREASURER'S FINANCIAL REPORT

The culmination of the 1983 - 84 season sees South Port S.L.S.C. placed in a rather precarious financial position. The building of the new clubhouse has absorbed much of the club's financial resources and has forced us into taking out a \$40,000 loan from the State Centre Trustees and a further \$30,000 loan will be made via the Noarlunga City Council. Repayment commitments on these loans will thus necessitate the club maintaining a tight control over its resources in the coming season. It is anticipated however that the new clubhouse facilities should help to provide much of the additional income required on a regular basis in the future.

The 1983 - 84 season saw a turnover in excess of \$175,000, the major expenditure being the clubhouse. However, other expenditures occurred in order to return the club to its pre-fire operating capacity. A new IRB, radio, and the tractor were all major items of expenditure. Major sources of income were once again State Centre Appeals, the Noarlunga Council, the Rolling Surf Lottery, plus this year the final disbursement on the Moana titles income came through, plus the club won in excess of \$1,000 at S.A. Senior Carnivals.

Unfortunately there have been a number of areas where I feel there has been a lot of unnecessary expenditure this year and I feel the club will have to control small items of expenditure much more tightly in the future.

Some mention should be made of the following aspects in the financial statements:-

- (a) Much of the current bank balance in the senior accounts is over \$4,000 from the Qantas Lottery which is, or has been, already committed to the purchase of a new rowing boat.
- (b) The ladies auxiliary were very active this year finishing the year with a surplus of over \$1,200. Well done to all the girls.
- (c) A very small deficit, even after accounting for debtors and stock in hand, occurred for the Silver Jubilee activities in the last season. If we account for the medallions won at the Club Championships a profit of around \$300 to \$400 would have been made. However, I believe that the profit margins on much of the items sold for the Silver Jubilee Year were too slim. A substantial profit is anticipated however for the Silver Jubilee Ball.
- (d) The Fun Run financially was extremely successful relative to last season, and the prospects look good for the future. Well done Andy Higgs.

CHIEF INSTRUCTOR'S REPORT

As far as the instruction side of lifesaving was concerned this last year had all the ingredients for disaster, the lack of facilities alone was enough to ensure that every little thing would be done the hard way, so we did not need the extra workload generated by the utterly chaotic eleventh hour introduction of the new handbook and the resultant "improved" efficiency tests. However, everyone pitched in so effectively that our members were duly claimed proficient by the prescribed days and we continued the education process throughout the season to eventually acquire a varied collection of Association Awards with the special bonus that our patrols achieved a greatly improved score in the patrol efficiency competition so that in retrospect we must admit that for a year that had so little to offer, it actually developed into one really worth remembering.

We remain indebted to Port Noarlunga for their generous provision of gear and premises for the second successive year, their co-operation was invaluable to coaches and candidates alike and I venture to suggest that our Award count would otherwise have been cause for apology instead of pride on achievement.

This report would not be complete without special thanks to Les Horne and his Rubber Boat boys and last of all mention must be made of John Nearmy and his endless support for all facets of the training process. These people made outstanding contributions but I don't believe that anyone had an easy season and we can be rightfully proud of the way South Port as a club coped with adversity. We can also be relieved that the worst is now over!

Again we had a strong contingent travel to Sydney for the January long weekend of carnivals - it is a fun trip and excellent training and experience. I recommend it to all competitors.

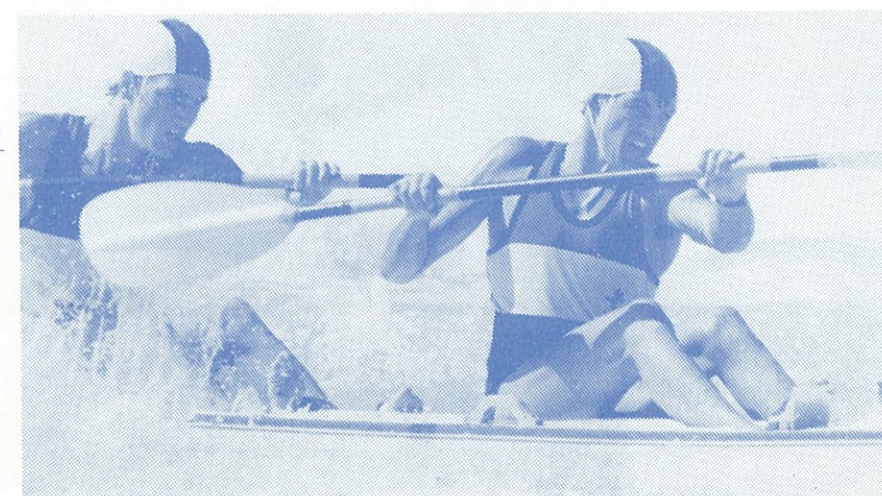
It was pleasing to note that attendance at carnivals was quite high.

Total engine hours - 220.0

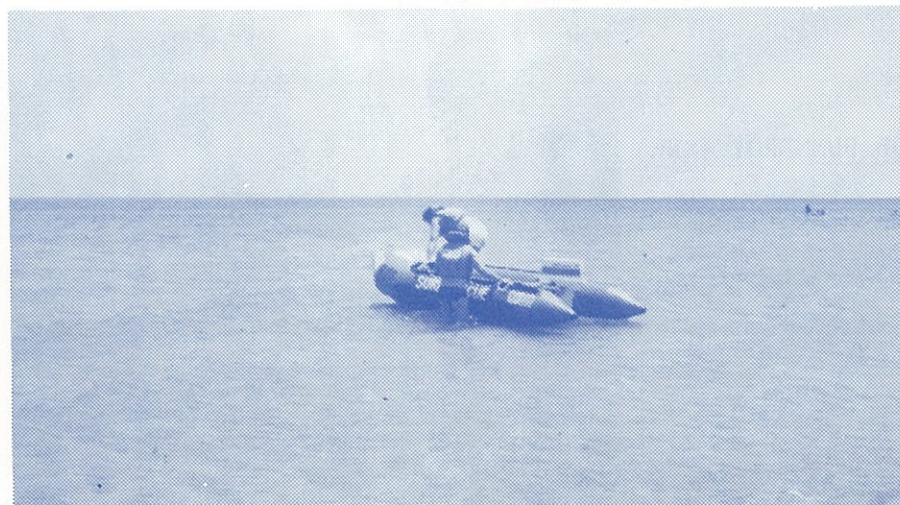

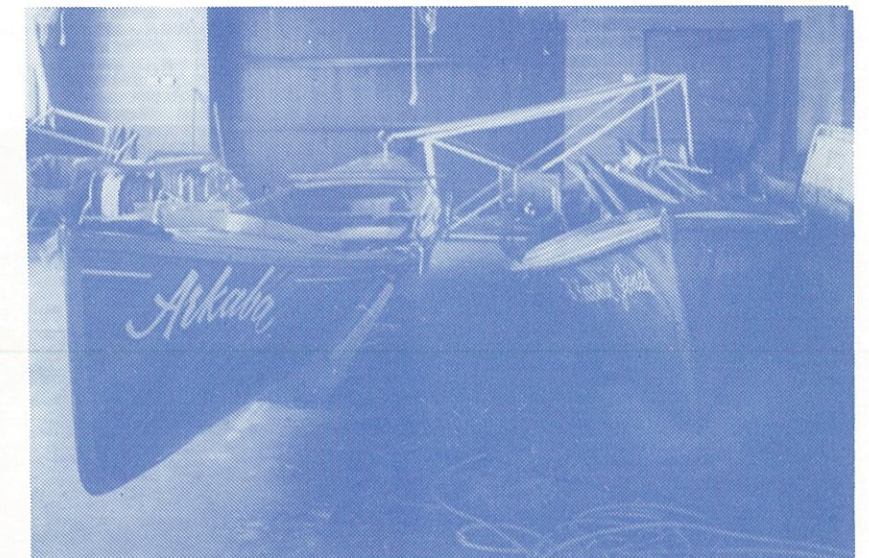
