







The objectives of the Club are:


- (a) To minimise the loss of life from drowning by providing patrols and apparatus.

- (f) To purchase, take on lease, exchange, hire or otherwise acquire and deal with any real or personal property, rights and privileges.
- (g) To raise funds and borrow monies for the purposes and benefit of the Club upon such terms and such conditions as may be determined.

41 patrol hours, with a grand total of 3,223 hours.

There was 63 first aid cases, 56 rescues and 173 preventative actions during patrolling hours. Most of these occurred during December as a result of the big rip.


I'd like to thank each and every patrolling member for the time and effort they've put in this season, and I hope to see more red and yellow quartered caps on the beach next season.

Thanks to John Nearmy, Dean Colegate and Prue Kumar for their help with Proficiencies.

This year has not seen as many awards due to a lack of help and support in this area. However I would like to thank those who did help me this season; especially Dean Colegate for the work he has done in the Surf Life Saving Certificate, Resuscitation Certificate and Junior Awards again this season. Dean had some helpers in these areas who I would also like to thank; namely Liz Colegate, Pam Scott and Brad Foord. Thanks also to Sam Bentley, Mark Nieass, and Stefan Olesinski for the work they put into training the Bronze Squads this season. Finally, thanks to all the IRB Drivers and those who helped out with water cover for the exams. Your assistance has been greatly appreciated.

THANKS TO YOU ALL.

As I mentioned, the awards are down this year but we have maintained our high standard and a 100% success rate which is very important. We are looked upon with high regard by the Examiners in the way we approach our training of awards and the standards we achieve.

Unfortunately the standards we achieve do not get the same recognition from a great number of our club members. This is shown in the attitude towards gaining Awards. Not only do we lack instructors, but at the present only have 1 competition referee (on a regular basis) and 3 examiners, two of which now only do a few exams a year. I believe this lack of interest in these areas has also led to a lack of responsibility by the Club in fulfilling the basic standard and requirements of patrolling. This is an area of great concern as it is the whole foundation of the Club's existence.

I believe South Port to be one of the best Surf Life Saving Clubs in the State, if not Australia. We have the best beach conditions in the State, the best March Past Team in Australia and other competitors who have shown they are very competitive. In the Junior movement we are strong in many areas especially in maintaining a family outlook and having fun.

South Port could be and should be the Number One Club in the State but this will require commitment by its members not only in their responsibilities to the Club but also to the Association as a whole. Remember the old saying 'if we all do a bit, a lot gets done'. This is what South Port as a whole needs to go by.

I have made it known that next season I will not be standing as Chief Instructor. This is a great disappointment to me as I had hoped to continue for a few more years. Unfortunately I have been placed in such a position this season that I feel it may be best for all concerned that I do not stand.

Thanks again to all those who have helped me over the last 2 years and I hope that the new Chief Instructor gets the help and support that is needed to be able to fulfil the position.

BOAT CAPTAIN'S REPORT




Well that went quickly didn't it? The season has ended once again and as usual we won a few and lost a few.

JUNIOR COMMITTEE REPORT

It was great to see the South Port Juniors perform so splendidly at the Surf Lifesaving and Royal Lifesaving State Titles, after a frustrating start to the season marked by poor weather conditions and a subsequent drop in children attending training and carnivals.

South Port SLSC

While numbers were down we competed well at all carnivals with many individuals consistently finishing in the top three. We finished 5th overall at the Junior State Championships with a score of 115. This means that we are the top Mid Coast club. Gold medals were won by Heath Hanton, Rachel Martin (2), Alex Botha and Gina Staples. Gold was also won by the 12 year old Cameron team. At the Royal Lifesaving State Titles we finished 4th overall which was a huge improvement on last year's last. Again, we were the top club on Beach Day which was hosted this year by South Port.

This year we purchased two wizard boards and three Genesis boards which enabled us to compete on an equal footing with other clubs. Many thanks to Gary Eastham for overseeing our purchases and repairs.

Sixty-four children were put through their National Junior Awards this season. Ten children and two adults completed their Resuscitation Certificates and five children and 2 adults gained their Surf Lifesaving Certificates. Many thanks to Dean Colegate and Ian Burton for their major roles in preparing and testing the candidates. Thanks also to Brad Foord, Pam Scott, Liz Colegate and Ray Martin Senior for their assistance.

A big thank you to the Junior Committee for their support and their efforts. Special thanks to Judith Botha as JDP rep for attending monthly meetings at Surf House. Congratulations and thanks to the Age Group Leaders, their Assistants and the Coaches for their outstanding efforts this season. Special mention to Rosie Howse and Liz Edge who not only cared for an age group but ran the Social and Fundraising Committee as well. Ray Martin Senior put in a fantastic effort as beach and pool swim coach and as organiser for the Royal Life

titles. Gary (Emu) Eastham must be mentioned again for his dedication in running three board training sessions a week. "Certainly this winter we have had heaps of rain and with the Onkaparinga River flushing and the easterly winds on the sand dunes, sand bars have been formed," he said. "In times of surf you have got a rip just south of the club and that is the best spot for surfing as it feeds off both sides of the rip. But with those conditions, there is no doubt it is going to be a pretty dangerous year for





- end of season trip to Moonta.


The Moonta trip was a great culmination for a great season. Our thanks to the Treacy family for their hospitality and we look forward to revisiting in the not too distant future.

- (a) the attached accounts present fairly the results of the operations of South Port Surf Life Saving Inc. for the financial year ended 30 April and the state of affairs of South Port Surf Life Saving Inc. as at the end of the financial year; and
- (b) there are reasonable grounds to believe that South Port Surf Life Saving Club Inc. will be able to pay its debts as and when they fall due.

SUMMARY OF FINANCIAL SITUATION AND MATTERS

From a financial standpoint, 1995/96 has clearly been a disappointing year. Total expenditure before depreciation (but including expenditure on fixed assets) exceeded income by in excess of \$3000, and the budget target was undershot by \$11000. In part this might be explained by the bringing forward of the purchase of a new IRB (approx. \$7000). However, this was offset by other significant expenditures that were planned but did not take place most notably the long awaited kitchen renovations. Overall, once changes in the value of fixed assets are accounted for, the 1995/96 season saw a decline in the estimated value of net assets of \$5463.

The main source of the much weaker financial performance over the last year has been the decline in revenue. Income is 16%

down on the previous season, and 23% down on the revenue level of two years ago. The main sources of the fall are: sponsorship revenue (down \$9300 on 93/94); prize money (down \$2800); canteen trading (down \$2600); State Centre disbursements (down \$1300); and labour services (down \$1200). On the other hand, hall hire is up as a result of bringing forward the rental agreement with the Pt Noarlunga Aquatics, and Fundraising activities, while down on last year, generated revenue on a par with 1993/94.

The star performer, however, has clearly been the bar. Bar profits are up 17% this year over last, with the profit margin up to 31.8%.

Canteen trading, on the other hand, has been very disappointing. The fall in sales was to be expected given last season we were hosts of the State Junior titles. Nevertheless, the profit margin has slipped quite noticeably — from 31.8% to just 17.7%.

Expenditure items, on the other hand, were mostly in line with expectations, with the notable exception perhaps of security services (reflecting the charging of call-outs by Wormald Security).

Significant capital items purchased during the season include the new IRB (\$6280), a new IRB motor (\$1790), three surf skis (\$4640), junior competition boards (\$2450), a set of rolling surf boat seats (\$1000), a rescue board (\$800) and a photocopier (\$700).

In conclusion, the incoming committee unfortunately begins the season with relatively meagre cash reserves, especially given the annual payment on the State Centre loan (\$5717) is due in May each year. Given it will be difficult to cut expenditure further, the new committee will need to give serious consideration to how additional sources of income can be found, and how the revenue flow from current sources can be increased.





AUDITOR'S REPORT


BOARD RIDERS REPORT


The club was well represented again by members in the state board riding contest.






We had a couple of senior carnivals this year. Thank you to everyone that contributed on those days.




