

## President's Report

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John Devitt

As I write this report the tenders have been released for the construction of the boardwalk from the end of the foot bridge to the Club. Our services will be relocated under the board walk, including a rising main to take our sewerage across to the Weatherald terrace trunk main, at last no more septic tank problems. This is a very expensive project in the high six figures funded at this stage by the City of Onkaparinga. This project has been on the go for about 15 years now and finally is coming to an end. During the construction of the board walk it will mean some disruption for us and we have to just put up with it for the short term for a long term gain. So be mindful that access will be restricted for a period they are going to get it done as soon as possible. Hopefully as you read this report that construction has begun or is about to, the aim is to have it finished by end of October or sooner. The company that does the job will need to use our toilets and store equipment in the Club and use it as a site office, lunch and morning tea, they will be using the kitchen as well. There are holes to be cut in our floors in the kitchen, bar, first aid room and canteen for connection to the grease arrestor being installed, it **will** be disruptive. So please be patient.

Late last year Bob Mayo approached us re-intending to build an extension and offered a very generous donation towards the project. Earlier this year Bob made a donation of \$100,000 to the Club and this has enabled us to proceed down the path towards getting the extension started. The money is sitting in a fixed term deposit and any withdrawals from that account require the signatures of Club President, Treasurer and Bob Mayo. We intend to fund the project ourselves because if we wait for the Facility Management Group funding that could be as many as 6 years away. We have appointed a Project Manager John Ward, from ECPM, John has been instrumental in many of the redevelopments of the other clubs and is an avid lifesaver himself. The concept plans for our extension on the southern side of the existing building are with the City of Onkaparinga, we are depending on their assistance. We have had many meetings in regard to our intentions and are now waiting on a response from the Coast Protection Board and then we'll plan our next step. We do have a problem that no other SLS Club in Australia faces in reality, we occupy a building in a very sensitive dune area with threats from sea encroachment to the front and back via the river, due to rising sea levels, this fact makes the Coast Protection Board very nervous, anyway were in their hands at the moment and awaiting the outcome. I would like to thank Dick Olesinski and Michael Campbell for the effort they have put in over the past year with this project, Olly spent an enormous amount of time lobbying the many varied organisations that have a say in what we do and finally spending hours putting in for a grant from the Department of Recreation and Sport on behalf of the City of Onkaparinga that we are still waiting on the outcome. Mike Campbell for his many hours of unpaid advice to the Council re what can and cannot be achieved in regard to our services coming across from Weatherald Terrace, Bill McCrae from the Council was very thankful for his assistance, Bill is also a great supporter of South Port.

In January Andrew Bedford applied for a grant to replace the Yamaha Rhino ATV after six seasons of use it was beginning to fail in many ways and the BOM deemed it necessary to replace it, the grant was through SLISA's program with BRP, they make the Commander range of ATV's those of you that attended the Worlds or Aussies would be familiar with this vehicle it's a lot more robust than the Rhino and it will service us very well into the future. Andy also arranged for the sale of our old ATV by auction and it sold quickly for \$3800 and we had to pay \$8800 for a machine that has a retail value of \$17K so not a bad outcome.

In closing my report I would like to congratulate Richard Olesinski. Olly was awarded the Order of Australia Medal this year for his service to Life Saving and to Conservation and the Environment.

This award was much deserved and just a very brief outline of Olly's commitment to both is as follows:-

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

Some highlights are listed below and these will be expanded upon by the various Officers in their reports.


- 43 rescues on our beach with 38 First Aid Cases and 670 preventative actions.

## Treasurer's Report

Don "Bristles" Alexander

The summarised report on income, expenditure and trading for the season 2012-2013 have been taken from the 2013 Audit conducted by Edward Jaynes, which is included as Annexure "A".

Cash on hand at the end of the financial year totalled \$155,253, the biggest amount ever in the Club's history, This was mainly due to an extremely generous donation from Bob Mayo of \$100,000, which has been invested in a fixed interest account. The remaining \$55,000 in the bank was a good finish for the year and provides ample funds to carry us over during the winter months.

In general income was on par with the previous season but as can be seen from the breakdown not a lot changed over with the exception of no Sponsorship money coming into the Club. On the expenditure side our costs continue to rise, mainly in Lifesaving Services, Patrols and Premises. As mentioned in last year's report, the main increases continue to be with electricity and water. The electricity bill was just over \$10,000 and the water bill \$6,500, although over \$4,000 was attributable to a water leak, which we were not able to have reduced.

Our Trading Operations continues to be the main contributor to our profits, with all three areas recording almost similar results from the previous year. A very special thanks to David 'Wal' Watt, Club House Manager and Yvonne Olesinski, Canteen Manager, for their contribution: both put in a considerable number of hours to ensure that the bar and canteen are well stocked, clean and staffed for the benefit of our members and guests. A special thanks to all members who donated their time to help behind the counter on the weekends and special occasions, your assistance is much appreciated.

### Grants

The Club has regularly received Grants from the many groups and while we are always thankful for the support, it should be pointed out that in some cases there is flow back of funds to the provider as the table below shows. While there is no question that the Club is in a better position with a long term lease from the City of Onkaparinga, we now have to pay for a number of items that we didn't pay for under the old arrangements. The expenditure with SLSSA is a total of all costs that we have been invoiced over the past financial year.



Congratulations to the March Past, Surf Boats and R&R areas, all had excellent results, another great club performance.



## South Port's Hooded Plovers!

South Port beach had two chicks this breeding season unfortunately they did not survive and it is not sure as to why however it is important that we as a club remain vigilant about protecting these tiny birds. Remember Hooded Plovers are small beach nesting birds which nest on the sand between the high-water mark and the base of the sand dunes during spring and summer, which is also the busiest time of the year on our beaches. Hooded plovers are listed as vulnerable under the *National Parks and Wildlife Act*, chicks and eggs are at risk from disturbance and trampling when people and their pets visit the beach. Disturbance of nesting adults can also affect the survival of chicks and eggs. People and their pets can unknowingly be their greatest threat.

## Fishy Mystery!

Many of you may recall the mass of dead fish that were washing up on our shorelines during March/April 2013. Several people have asked me why they are washing up and what was with the dead dolphins washing up also. There could be a multitude of possible answers with many sceptics pointing the blame towards the desalination plant. You are free to have your own opinions of course however, in my own opinion as an independent scientist and having conversations with other scientists on this issue, the most logical conclusion (for the fish at least) is that there has been a toxic algal bloom (non-toxic to humans) caused by the above average water temperatures. The type of algae which has caused such a mass death is in fact a diatom (microscopic algae) that attaches to the gills of fish and essentially suffocates them. Juveniles and localised reef fish are more susceptible to such changes in environmental conditions. As for the dolphins, biopsies are still being conducted however the results that have come back so far indicate it is a highly contagious virus with one PhD student at Flinders University commenting "it is like the measles virus we get but for dolphins".

Both Dick Olesinski and I sit on the State EcoSurf committee, South Port as a club are perceived as being an EcoSurf 'model' for other clubs in the state, with a dedicated Environment Officer on the committee and Board of Management. Because of South Port's environmental successes, EcoSurf South Australia is looking to roll out what we've been doing to other clubs in the state. This is a massive achievement for South Port and a lot of the hard work is done by dedicated members. As we all are aware, this club cannot function with the efforts of only one or two people so I would like end my report with a call to get others in club involved in helping to care for the environment in and around the club, even if it is taking the bins across the footbridge each week, every little bit counts.


