(c) Reserve Active membership will continue indefinitely as long as the minimum hours are achieved each season.

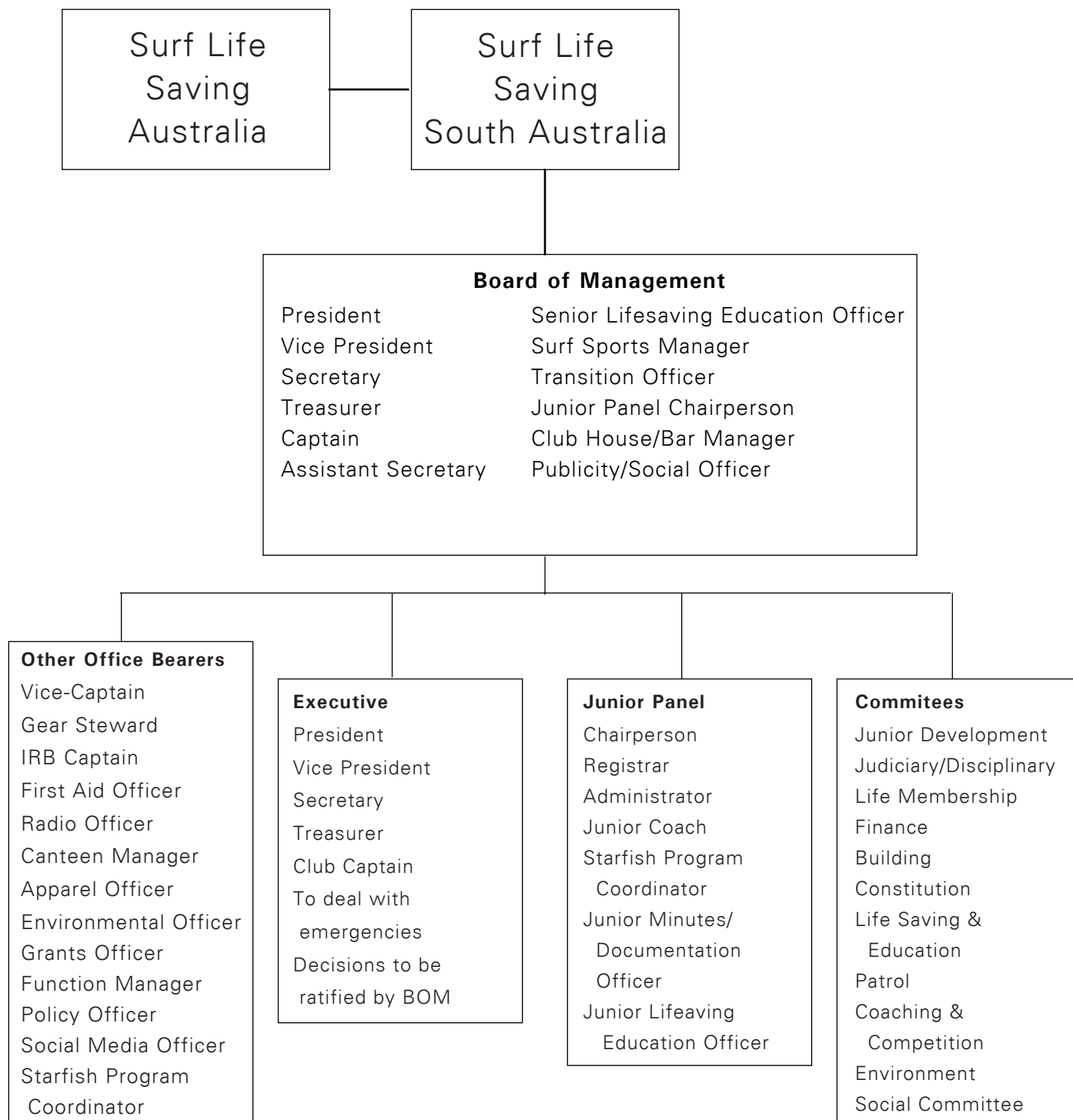

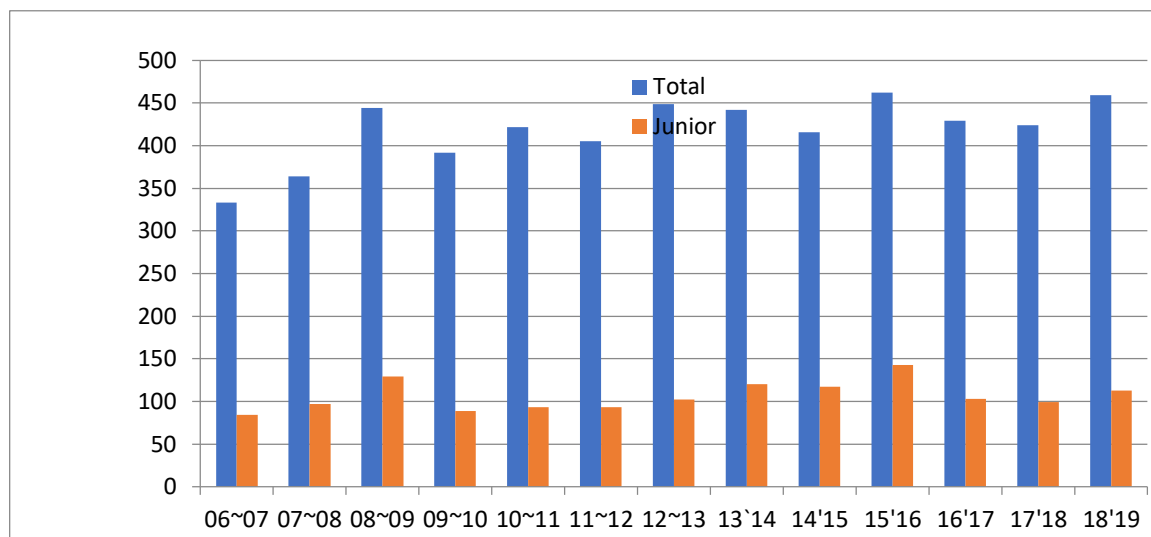

TREASURER'S REPORT

Don 'Bristles' Alexander

The summarised report on income, expenditure and trading for the season 2018-19 has been taken from the 2019 Audit conducted by PCS Accountants, which is included as Annexure "A".

The financial position of the Club has improved considerably over the past few years with this year's profit of \$56,648 a new high. Many factors and people contributed to this result but no doubt the main contribution has been the introduction of the monthly Blues Session, which at times proves difficult for a limited few who put in their time and effort for bar duties but overall it is a great initiative.

Cash and cash equivalents improved from \$130,492 to \$169,803 of which \$133,354 has been invested in term deposits at the ANZ Bank and People's Choice Credit Union.

The Club received Grants and Sponsorship from:

Donations supporting the Club during the season came from Woolcock Construction, Bernie Lewis Home Loans, Brian Johns, the Lipman Family, Simon Linden and the Shags. Surf Boat Fundraising contributed \$6,311 this season, through the efforts of Jason McGaffin in his position as Surf Boat Captain, particularly in using the resources of the Australian Sports Foundation and the surf boat supporters of the Club.

During the year the Club purchased lifesaving and competition equipment, including an IRB and motors, boards for seniors and juniors and skis.

This is my last year as Treasurer and I'd like to thank all past and present members for their contributions over the past 20 years of my time as Treasurer of the Club. In particular to all the Presidents: Chris Foord, John Devitt, Michael Campbell and Richard Olesinski who have been outstanding leaders; the Secretaries: John Smith and Michelle Copley for their administration control; David Watt, who has consistently enabled our financial position to reflect the time he spends on running the bar and social events and Yvonne Olesinski for her time in the canteen and organising clothing for our members.

Good luck for the future and I am pleased to report that the Club is solvent.

Overall it has been a very successful year for the Club, with patrols running smoothly (most of the time) and a number of training courses being run for our members. As you may be aware, for the first time in a long time, this season saw us purchase a lot of vital new equipment across the whole Club.

- 2 Patrol tents
- Patrol rashies
- 4 New Rescue Boards
- IRB and motors
- First Aid Equipment
- Skis and Boards for competition

Looking at our statistics from the season proves that all of our members on patrol did an excellent job of keeping the beach safe. I was happy to see that over 13,000 people visited the beach during patrol times, and we only had to treat 107 first aid cases, with 16 rescues or major incidents. This is partly due to the fact that we have a very safe beach, but the 550+ preventative actions performed by our patrols would undoubtedly have helped to avoid many dangerous situations and ensure that those 13,000 people went home safely at the end of the day.

We had 9 Patrol teams patrolling, which equates to 132 members completing over 3400 hours and doing an excellent job, however for too long we have relied on a small group of people each year to carry most of the patrolling load. It's time for everyone else to step up and do their bit for the Club.

Can we next year aim for every single active patrolling member of the Club to do at least 20 hours of patrol? Whichever, way you want to put it, it really isn't much time, especially when you are on the beach with your friends, doing something good for the community.

I'd like to encourage any members or friends/family of members who aren't involved in the patrolling aspect of the Club, to think about doing their bronze and get involved. Rest assured, that no matter your skill level or age, there are positions you can help with on patrol.

We particularly need more adults to patrol. This season's adult Bronze courses worked really well. If anyone is interested in getting involved, get in touch with me and we'll sort something out.

It was also refreshing to see so many new faces at the Club, especially in the Junior area. This area is a major focus and ensures that moving into the future we have a strong Club.

Also, I would like to thank Don "Bristles" Alexander for helping in ensuring that moving forward, the Club is in a good financial position. He has been squirreling away money over the years which has enabled us to purchase new equipment and set us up for the new building at Wearing Street.

Lastly, I acknowledge that there is always room for improvement, and would love any feedback (positive and negative) that you may have for the Club.

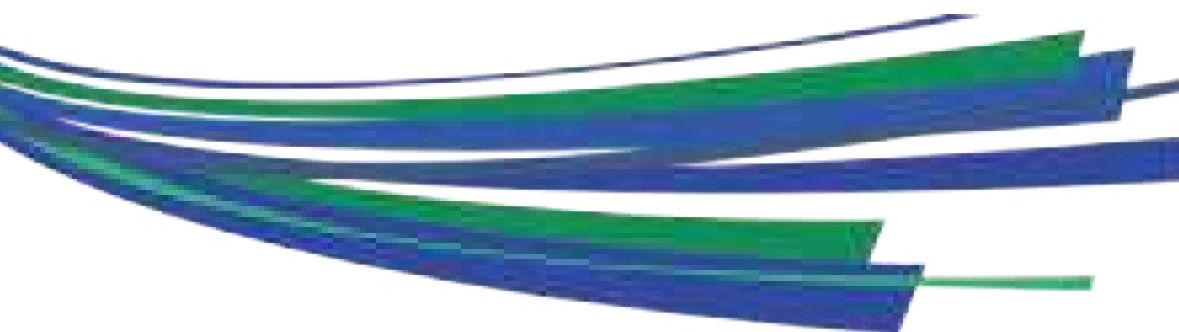

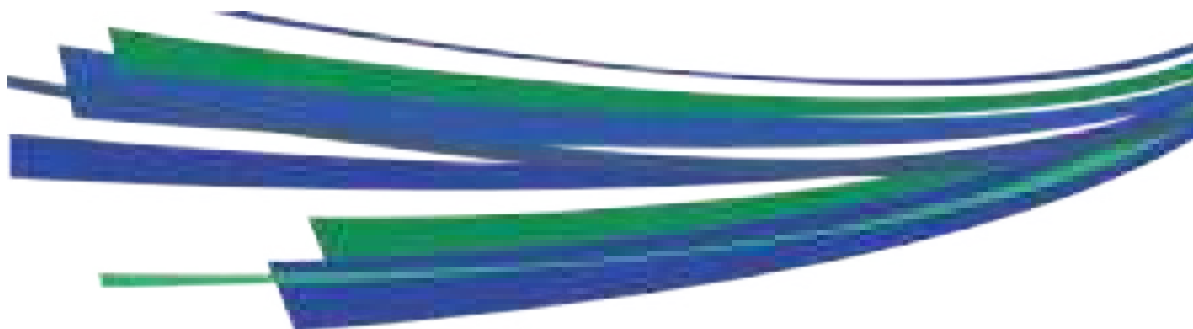

Medals were won in Masters female Board Rescue, U17 Board Relay, U17, U19 and Open female Surf Teams, U12 female Line Throw and U12/13 Obstacle Relay.

The World Surf Lifesaving Championships were held in December at Glenelg Beach. South Port had four competitors from the Board and Ski area, three Surf Boat crews and the Open March Past Team.

Thanks to the Board of Management who have supported the Surf Sports areas with a new boat, board and ski equipment.

Surf Sports started an Instagram account in late February, with 186 followers to date. Thanks to Richie Cunningham for the idea and with the assistance of Laura Odell and Alex Botha we have been able to promote our beautiful beach and surf sports to the community.

This season Club Championships were held over 2 days incorporating Nippers, Seniors and Masters. 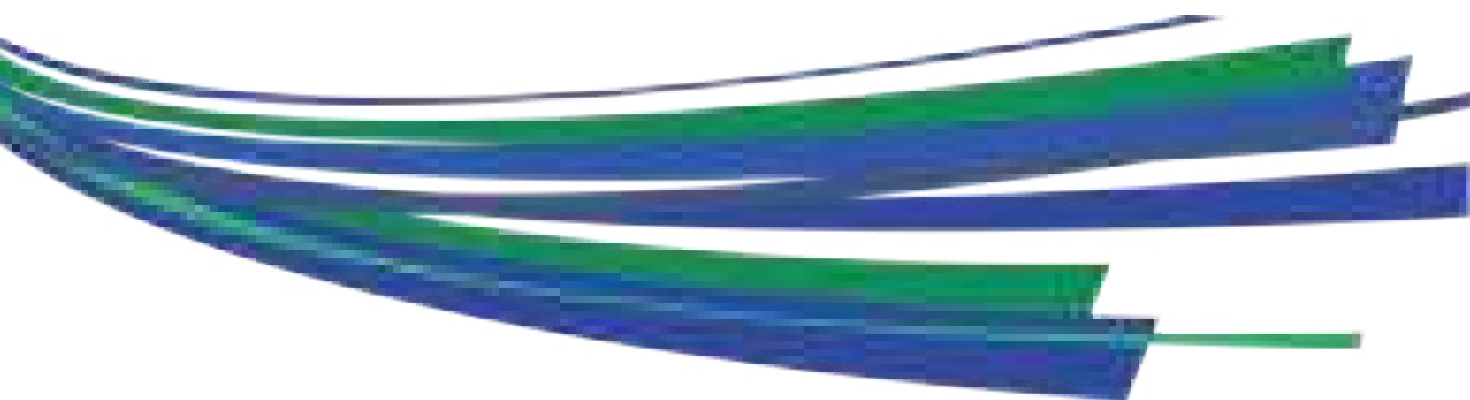

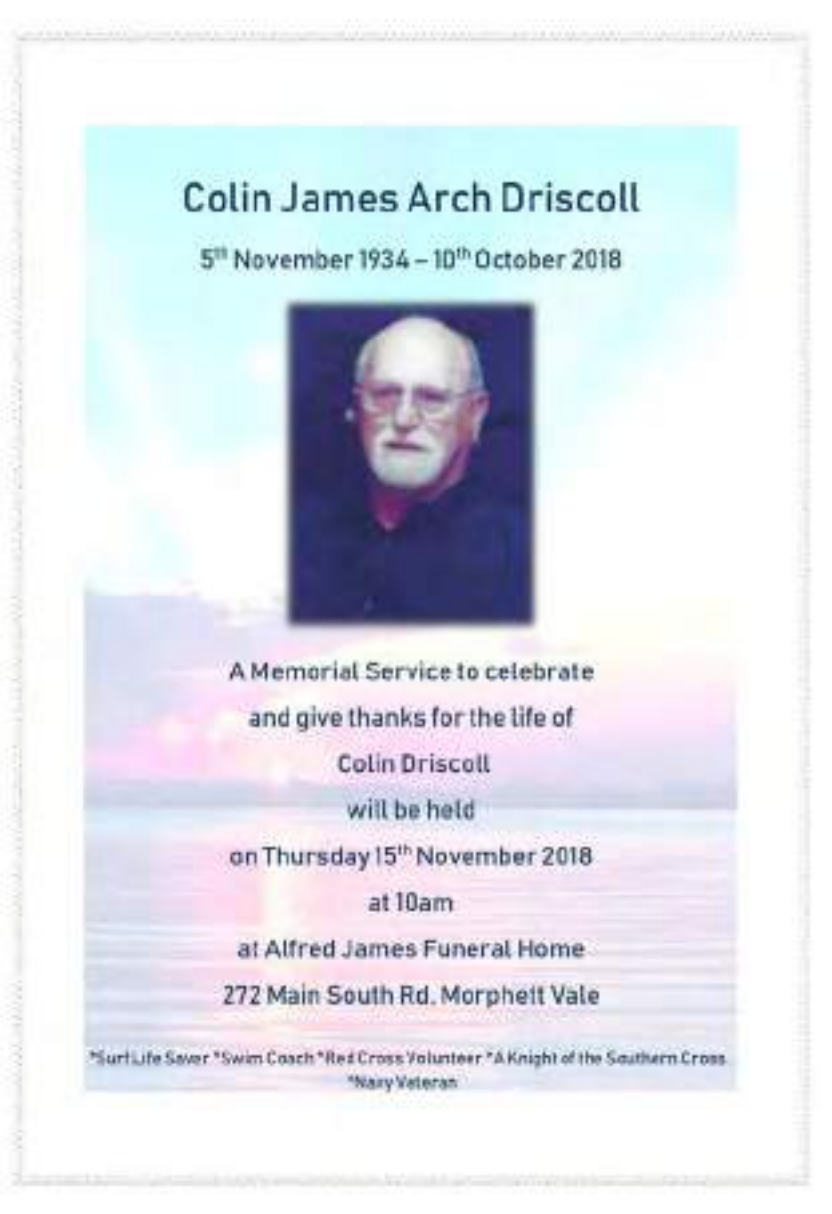


COLIN DRISCOLL**1934 - 2018**

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS
FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2019

The financial statements cover SOUTH PORT S.L.S.C as an individual entity. SOUTH PORT S.L.S.C is a not for profit Association incorporated in SA under the Associations Incorporation Act 1985.

The functional and presentation currency of SOUTH PORT S.L.S.C is Australian dollars.

Comparatives are consistent with prior years, unless otherwise stated.

1 Basis of Preparation

In the opinion of the Committee of Management, the Association is not a reporting entity since there are unlikely to exist users of the financial report who are not able to command the preparation of reports tailored so as to satisfy specifically all of their information needs. These special purpose financial statements have been prepared to meet the reporting requirements of the Act.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement requirements of the Australian Accounting Standards and Accounting Interpretations, and the disclosure requirements of AASB 101 Presentation of Financial Statements, AASB 107 Statement of Cash Flows, AASB 108 Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors and AASB 1054 Australian Additional Disclosures.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities.

2 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies
Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost of inventory is determined using the first-in-first-out basis and are net of any rebates and discounts received.

Net realisable value is estimated using the most reliable evidence available at the reporting date and inventory is written down through an obsolescence provision if necessary.

Plant and Equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment.

Depreciation

The depreciable amount of all plant and equipment is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Impairment of Non-Financial Assets

At the end of each reporting period the association determines whether there is an evidence of an impairment indicator for non-financial assets.

Where this indicator exists and regardless for goodwill, indefinite life intangible assets and intangible assets not yet available for use, the recoverable amount of the asset is estimated.

Where assets do not operate independently of other assets, the recoverable amount of the relevant cash-generating unit (CGU) is estimated.

The recoverable amount of an asset or CGU is the higher of the fair value less costs of disposal and the value in use. Value in use is the present value of the future cash flows expected to be derived from an asset or cash-generating unit.

Where the recoverable amount is less than the carrying amount, an impairment loss is recognised in profit or loss.

Reversal indicators are considered in subsequent periods for all assets which have suffered an impairment loss, except for goodwill.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprises cash on hand, demand deposits and short term investments which are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is recognised when the amount of the revenue can be measured reliably, it is probable that economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the association and specific criteria relating to the type of revenue as noted below, has been satisfied.

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable and is presented net of returns, discounts and rebates.

Sale of goods

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised at the point of delivery as this corresponds to the transfer of significant risks and rewards of ownership of the goods and the cessation of all involvement in those goods.

Interest revenue

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method.

Rendering of services

Revenue in relation to rendering of services is recognised depending on whether the outcome of the services can be estimated reliably. If the outcome can be estimated reliably then the stage of completion of the services is used to determine the appropriate level of revenue to be recognised in the period. If the outcome cannot be reliably estimated then revenue is recognised to the extent of expenses recognised that are recoverable.

If the outcome cannot be reliably estimated then revenue is recognised to the extent of expenses recognised that are recoverable.

Revenue from training services is generally recognised once the training has been delivered.
