

It was wonderful to have an uninterrupted season back at the Club and on the beach. Importantly, there were no lives lost on our beautiful stretch of sand.

Over the past season we have had a total of 9 rescues, 704 preventive actions, 4125 patrolling hours completed this season to ensure the 12,000 people recorded attending the beach are kept safe.

With the official opening of our new changerooms, the unveiling of our new "Australian Champions" wall, regular Sunday sessions, board training, ski training, Club swims and Nipper trainings, branch and senior carnivals, the Club was a very busy place over the summer season.

We welcomed 29 new bronze holders and 5 new SCR awards. Thank you for committing to becoming part of our incredible Club patrol teams. Whilst patrolling carries great responsibility, it is such a privilege to do so when you are surrounded by the wonderful environment in which our Club is situated. Being part of what is such an iconic Australian association brings with it a sense of community that I really believe doesn't exist in other organisations. We look forward to seeing you patrolling the beach. Thanks to Noelene and Barry for their commitment to training and assessment of South Port members.

#### Highlights for season 2022/2023:

- 226 members competing between the ages of U6 Open.
- Opening of the new bathroom and changeroom facilities
- Unveiling of the Australian Champions Wall
- Continued consultation and progression of the Wearing Street redevelopment (due for commencement of construction later this year)
- South Port youth division continuing to grow in numbers and achieving excellent competition results.
- Surf Babies again conducted on our beach providing a pathway to nippers for young children and their families.
- The Friday "Bar Fly's" a group who continue to work together 'behind the scenes' ensuring our clubrooms are in ship shape condition each week.
- A cohesive Board of Management who have worked together to ensure that the Club ran smoothly.
- Multiple Gold medallists at State Championships including almost a 'clean sweep' of March Past Junior (Gold), Under 23 (Silver) and Open (Gold) all medalling at the State Championships.
- The most successful Aussie Titles for our Board and Ski team for many years, with multiple athletes from other clubs choosing to transfer in for the championships, and many finals made. Special mention to our swimmers including Amy Buck for a silver medal in the Under 17 Belt, our Open Men swim team, for making the final a massive achievement.

# Treasurer's Report Cassandra Stoodley

Onwards and upwards! This financial year has seen an increase in income across the board we continue to return to pre Covid-19 and Clubroom renovation conditions.

Audited financials are based on 1 May 2022 to 30 April 2023.

Cash in the bank and cash equivalents at the end of FY23 has increased by \$24,612 from last year to \$324,935. At the risk of sounding like a broken record, a fair chunk of these funds will be used for the Wearing Street development with commencement expected this year.

#### 1. Sales:

- a. Bar: Sales for the year increased from last year to \$90,328, with cost of goods \$43,256, the bar made a profit of \$48,288. Thank you to John 'Devo' Devitt in the early days, Coral McWhinney and David 'Wal' Watt for the remainder of the year, the Bar Fly's and all the volunteers for making this possible.
- b. Apparel: Whilst sales of \$14,121 are down this financial year they were still very healthy. The previous three years have seen exceptional results which cannot be expected to be sustained long term. Afterall, our members can only wear so much apparel and 'slow fashion' is better for the environment. Apparel made a small profit of \$263 with closing stock sitting at \$7,594. Great job Sally!
- c. Canteen: It was great to see the canteen back up and running for the full season with sales steadily increasing to \$5861 and a profit of \$2,693. Well done Donna Logan and the volunteers!
- 2. Fundraising: income for FY23 \$29,867 less costs \$13,066 = \$16,801 profit an increase from last year as we return to pre Covid-19 activities. Thank you to all involved who have spent countless hours not only raising funds for our Club but also organising fun events for members and the wider community.
- 3. Grants: A successful year with a total of \$76,334 received.
- 4. Sponsorship and Donations: A tidy sum of \$48,381 was received this season. Thank you to all who made this possible!

## CAPTAIN'S REPORT Lyndon Mills

Let's not lose sight to why we are here, Patrolling is our core business and for the 63rd year we have maintained our proud record of no lives lost between the flags at South Port.

This was another successful season due to the commitment of our volunteer lifesavers. Between October - April, our lifesavers collectively patrolled 4120 plus hours (up from last year) taking care of approximately 12000 visitors to our beach.

All patrols performed well over the season and was great seeing more new faces along with the return of some old salty one.

In this time, we achieved our core objective to ensure zero preventable drownings in our waters. We did this by performing 9 rescues, responding to 44 first aid incidents, 704 preventative actions. This is a considerable undertaking for our Club and meant that beach goers were able to return home safely to their families at the end of the day.

I would like to thank the patrol captains and vice captains for continuing to lead their teams, at times with reduced numbers.

Thanks also to those who committed to additional patrols.

A big thank you also to all our trainers for putting in the time to train and complete our Club proficiencies. It's like herding cats it's always a challenge.

## SENIOR AWARDS OF EXCELLENCE **CLUB DINNER PHOTOS**




















This season was a medal tally instead of a point score to determine the champion clubs for seniors and masters. For the juniors, it was a champion club based on five pillars of surf lifesaving.

SLSSA Senior State Championships - South Port finished 7th overall, with 12 gold, 16 silver and 13.5

SLSSA Masters State Championships - South Port finished 8th overall with 9 gold, 19 silver and 19 bronze medals.

SLSSA Junior State Championships, Champion Club - South Port finished fifth overall for the champion club. South Port was fifth, overall, in the medal tally for competition, but was the top song in the sports participation environment category, which takes into account, attitudes at carnivals of competitors, Parents, volunteers, and supporters, showing that we are raising our youngest Surf Sports SLSSA to behave and act in a respectful and sportsmanlike manner.

None of these results could be achieved without the amazing commitment from our coaches, Alex Botha (Board, Iron and Nippers), Sean Lohse (Ski), Jason and Keith (Boats), Clayton Jones (Sprints and Beach Flags) and Alex Gettie (Tuesday nights Swimming). He assisted around the Club wherever he could with duties such as helping to set-up and pack-up the Junior and Senior Carnivals when South Port was hosting and turning his hand and his energies to any other jobs that needed attention.

One of his regular jobs was to assist with the cleanout of the old septic tank, although this particular job was not one of his favourites, as on one occasion the pipe exploded and he ended up covered in the contents of the septic tank!

In 1989 Kev and June moved to the Gold Coast but eventually returned to SA and settled in Encounter Bay for some time before moving to Seaford.

Kev and the Watt family have been members of South Port for over 50 years. Kev regularly enjoyed a beer or 3 as an elite drinker at the South Port Bar with his mates. He was a gentle, easy-going man who loved to have a laugh, was very loved and is greatly missed.

Kev's memorial service was held at Port Noarlunga SLSC on 21 October 2022, with a few people kicking on and ringing the bell in Kev's honour back at South Port. Kev's ashes were cast at sea at South Port SLSC on 19 February 2023, followed by larger celebrations which included many Life Members, at Kev's favourite place, the South Port Bar.

The financial statements cover South Port SLSC as an individual entity. South Port SLSC is a not-for-profit association incorporated in South Australia under the Associations Incorporation Act 1985 ('the Act').

The principal activity of the association for the year ended 30 April 2023 is:

Surf Life Saving

Comparatives are consistent with prior years, unless otherwise stated.

#### 1 Basis of preparation

In the opinion of the committee of management, South Port SLSC is not a reporting entity since there are unlikely to exist users of the financial statements who are not able to command the preparation of reports tailored so as to satisfy specifically all of their information needs. These special purpose financial statements have been prepared to meet the reporting requirements of the Act.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement requirements of the Australian Accounting Standards and Accounting Interpretations, and the disclosure requirements of AASB 101 Presentation of Financial Statements, AASB 107 Statement of Cash Flows, AASB 108 Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors and AASB 1054 Australian Additional Disclosures.

The financial statements and material accounting policies all comply with the recognition and measurement requirements in the Australian Accounting Standards.

#### 2 Summary of significant accounting policies

#### Income tax

The association is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

#### Revenue and other income

Revenue is recognised when the amount of the revenue can be measured reliably, it is probable that economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the Association and specific criteria relating to the type of revenue as noted below, has been satisfied.

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable and is presented net of returns, discounts and rebates.

#### Sale of goods

Revenue is recognised on transfer of goods to the customer as this is deemed to be the point in time when risks and rewards are transferred and there is no longer any ownership or effective control over the goods.

#### Interest revenue

Interest is recognised using the effective interest method.

#### Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprises cash on hand, demand deposits and short-term investments which are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

#### Property, plant and equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment.

At the end of each annual reporting period, the depreciation method, useful life and residual value of each asset is reviewed. Any revisions are accounted for prospectively as a change in estimate.

#### Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost of inventory is determined using the first-in-first-out basis and is net of any rebates and discounts received. Net realisable value is estimated using the most reliable evidence available at the reporting date and inventory is written down through an obsolescence provision if necessary.

#### Impairment of non-financial assets

At the end of each reporting period, the association determines whether there is an evidence of an impairment indicator for non-financial assets.

Where this indicator exists and regardless for goodwill, indefinite life intangible assets and intangible assets not yet available for use, the recoverable amount of the assets is estimated.

Where assets do not operate independently of other assets, the recoverable amount of the relevant cash-generating unit (CGU) is estimated.

The recoverable amount of an asset or CGU is the higher of the fair value less costs of disposal and the value in use. Value in use is the present value of the future cash flows expected to be derived from an asset or cash-generating unit.

Where the recoverable amount is less than the carrying amount, an impairment loss is recognised in profit or loss.

Reversal indicators are considered in subsequent periods for all assets which have suffered an impairment loss, except for goodwill.


