GEAR STEWARDS REPORT

On arriving in Perth I transported craft back and forth to beaches for competitors to train on before the big event at Easter. On Easter Friday, Saturday and Sunday, our fellow club members strived to their limit to win and some were successful. One fellow clubman was unfairly dealt with which was disappointing but he did not give up. Our members in competition this year have improved greatly from the previous year in Queensland- if this trend continues we will surely strike gold at the Nationals. The trip to Perth was a success and I congratulate all members who took part for making such a fine effort.

VICE-CAPTAIN REPORT

During the 1978/79 season the patrolling of our beach once again went very smoothly. Again this year there were no major incidents of note with a fairly small number of rescues being performed and an average number of first aid cases treated.

The past season however saw revolutionary changes in the 'Blue Book' and consequently in rescue and resuscitation techniques. In order to gear our club to keep up with these changes a much more comprehensive and testing patrol efficiency competition design this year. The competition tested the lifesaver's fitness, his knowledge of the new resuscitation techniques, and his ability to tackle real life rescue situations. Mick Stead should be commended for the time and effort he put in assessing all the patrols three times. Needless to say the patrol led by yours truly was head and shoulders above the rest and won by a mammoth two points.

Once again the average patrol was well over the minimum number of patrol members with the patrol hours being more equally distributed than in previous years. Congratulations to Peter Sutton the top patrol member, but all members should be congratulated for all the hours they put in. Next year, hopefully, all active bronze holders will patrol on the beach for more than twenty five hours each.

In conclusion I would like to reiterate my conclusion of last year in commend our Captain, Andy Higgs, and sincerely hope that we can change his mind and get him to accept captainship for another year.
