Financially our Club is sound and the Club administration is in the hands of capable and enthusiastic members. Under such circumstances, I am sure that Season 1982/83 can be successful, but success will only come if there is a determined and dedicated effort by each and every member. I urge all members to give the incoming Committee their full support to make 1982/83 our best season yet.

VICE-CAPTAIN'S REPORT

1981/82 patrol wise was a rather poor year. A Surf Life Saving Club's first duty is to patrol the beach and ensure that it is safe for swimmers, but unfortunately many of our members did not seem to realize that. Patrols have been looked upon as a dull by-product of being a member of a Surf Life Saving Club.

Seventeen members at the completion of the patrolling season still have yet to complete their patrolling commitments in the form of penalty patrols, a number of whom I would suggest may find it difficult to renew their membership.

The Australian Titles week-end was generally regarded as a good week-end for the Club but as regards to patrols it was a debacle. A number of people did not front for their patrols at Moana and our Captain found great difficulty in trying to get people to fill in, they just refused. Then on Sunday we were left with an unpatrolled beach at South Port for 1½ hours. Most of the patrol did not turn up while at least one was at Moana watching the Titles. That Simon had to go back to South Port himself because of lack of help is a sad reflection on the Club. Next year I will be pressing for Simon's reappointment as Captain but I believe he will be reluctant to take the job unless he can get the full co-operation of all of the Club's members.

Next year I will urge that the Club not only police more heavily penalty patrols but also to come down on cases of members refusing to follow instructions from Patrol Captains, insolence towards Patrol Captains and Club Members surfing in the swimming area. Please note also that penalties are allocated at the discretion of the Captain or Vice-Captain. That is, the person penalized has little say in the matter. This was not generally understood last season.

On the bright side the beach was patrolled for a record 1921.25 hours but the average hours patrolled by each member was again below 30 hours. David Watt ran away with the Patrol Hours Trophy, again! I would also like to commend Kevin Stephens and Mark Parsons who patrolled for over 50 hours each, including both days of the Australian Titles. Our Club's contribution to patrolling at Aldinga Bay seemed to go well, but I hope this is not to continue into next season.

In conclusion I would urge that next year all members approach patrols with a more positive attitude. If a club cannot operate cohesively when it comes to its basic function, patrolling, then it is not a good Surf Life Saving Club, regardless of how well it competes or socializes.

With increasing numbers being involved in Craft, the task of Maintenance is becoming a real problem. This is the big problem with the current Club policy of supplying Craft where possible. Whilst some members assist by doing their own repairs and looking after the Craft as requested and expected, many others unfortunately do not. If the task of maintenance continues to grow, then it may be necessary for a review of Club Policy.

For the first time since becoming Board and Ski Captain it has been necessary to dispose of some of our old Boards to the local Dump. Most of these boards are seven to eight years old, so they have served us well.
